



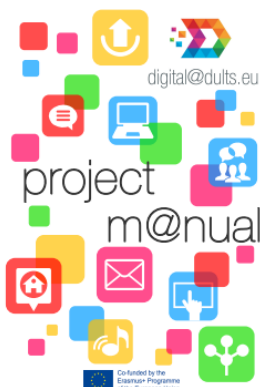
Project updates

The project staff training event took place in two phases, the first one [online](#) in February 2021 and the second [in presence](#) in Kalamata GR hosted by the Greek partner AREADNE from August 30th until September 3rd 2021.
